"Little green" is another way to say Petit Verdot. This grape is typically blended with other Bordeaux style varietals and contributes structure, dark color and weight to a wine. On its own, the purity of the fruit presents hints of tangy blackberry with herbal notes of anise and black tea. Enjoy this wine with grilled red meats and smoked cheeses.

VINTAGE NOTES

- Winter temperatures were average preceding the 2019 growing season resulting in little to no vine damage and bud break occurred normally.
- Warm spring temperatures created excellent conditions for canopy growth and early fruit development.
- Summertime temperatures were mild followed by cooler fall temperatures which were ideal for maintaining acidity and developing beautiful fruit flavors and aromas.

VINEYARD NOTES

- 51% of the fruit was sourced from our Cold Creek Vineyard. The low yielding old vines produce small clusters, resulting in intense flavors.
- 46% of the fruit was sourced from our Canoe Ridge Estate Vineyard, which lies along the Columbia River in Washington's Horse Heaven Hills AVA.
- 3% Syrah from Archie Den Hoed vineyard rounded out the blend.

WINEMAKING NOTES

- Grapes were sorted with a new grape receiving system and MOG (materials other than grapes) separation system that gets fruit to the fermenters.
- Ripe grapes were destemmed and inoculated with a variety of yeasts for maximum complexity.
- Aged for 18 months in 28% new French oak and 5% new American oak, 67% neutral French oak.

RECOMMENDED FOOD PAIRINGS

• Enjoy this Petit Verdot with grilled red meats and smoked cheeses.
